Now, just open to the book for each class and do 1 lesson or read 1 chapter together. Follow a read-talk-write-recite pattern for the lesson (see introduction for details). Keep to lesson times and don't worry about completing a chapter if time is up. Just progress through the books and be consistent with the times.

In this way, you can skip lesson planning, and jump right into learning with your children. Throw in a hands-on project once a week or so – such as painting or playdough. Warmly, Renee
